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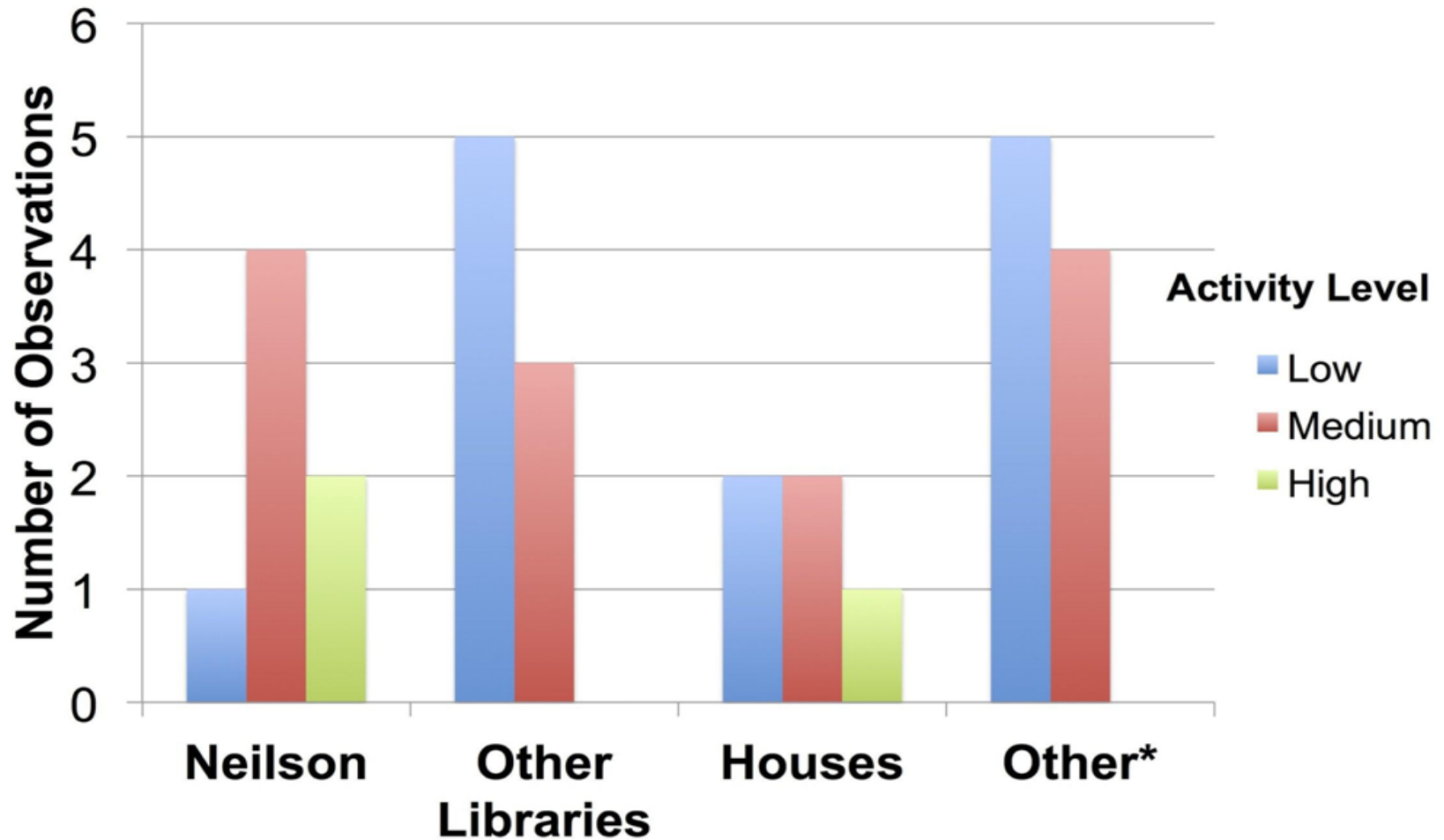

## Popularity in Study Location (n=42)

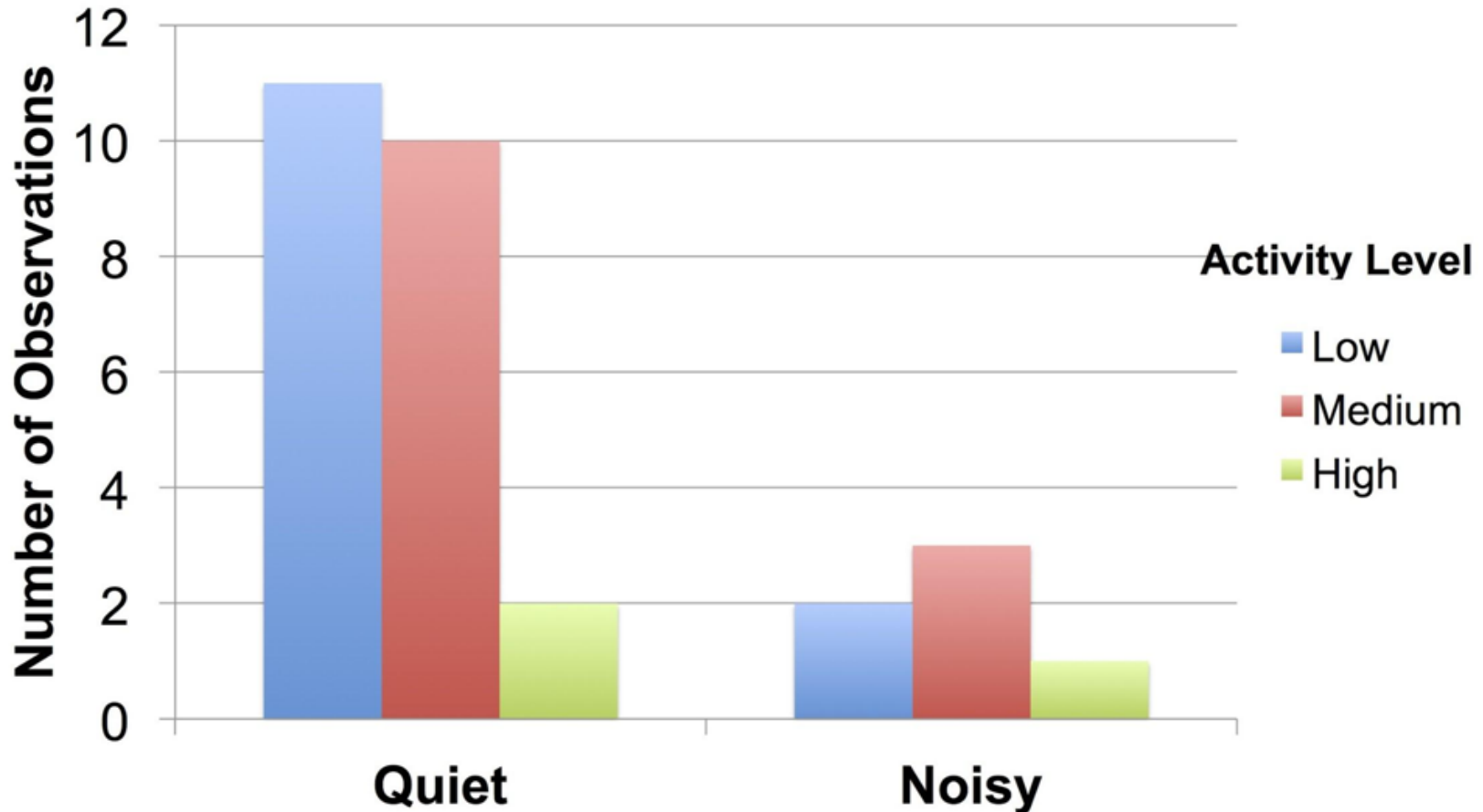

“Neilson is a little sad and gloomy.”

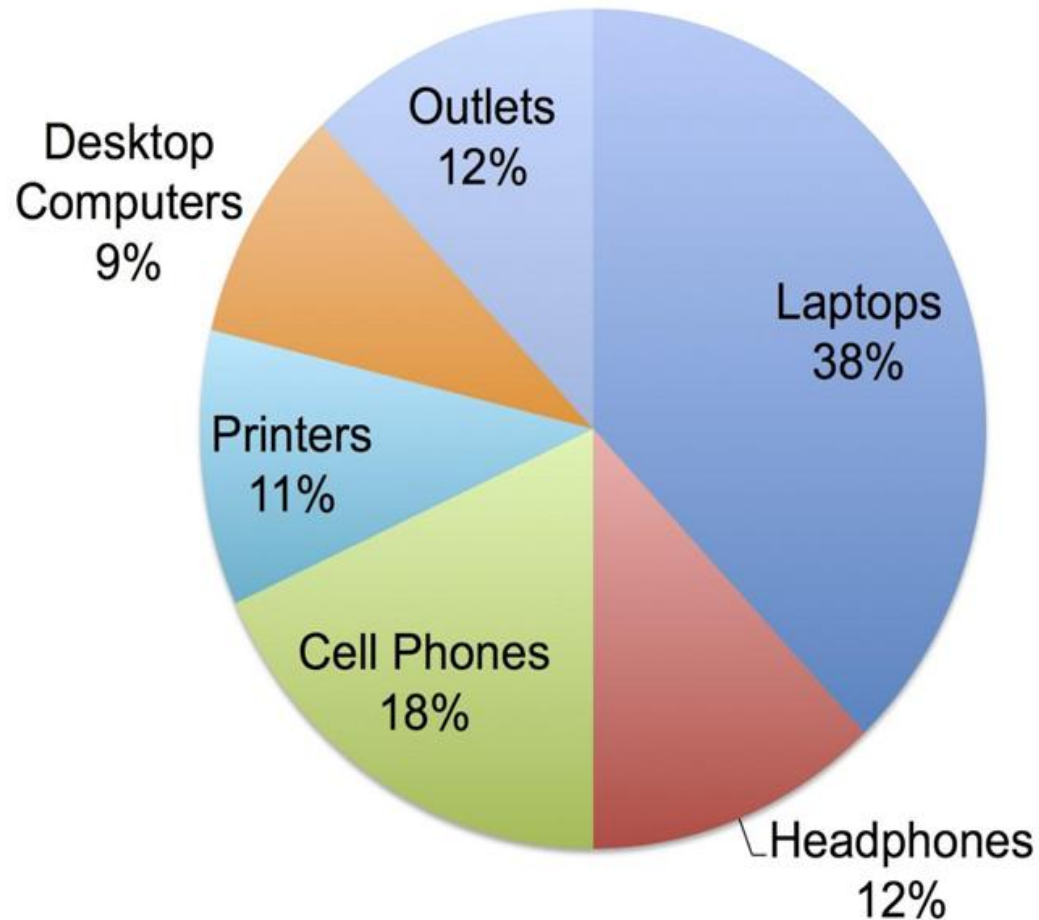
## Popularity in Noisy vs. Quiet (n=42)
