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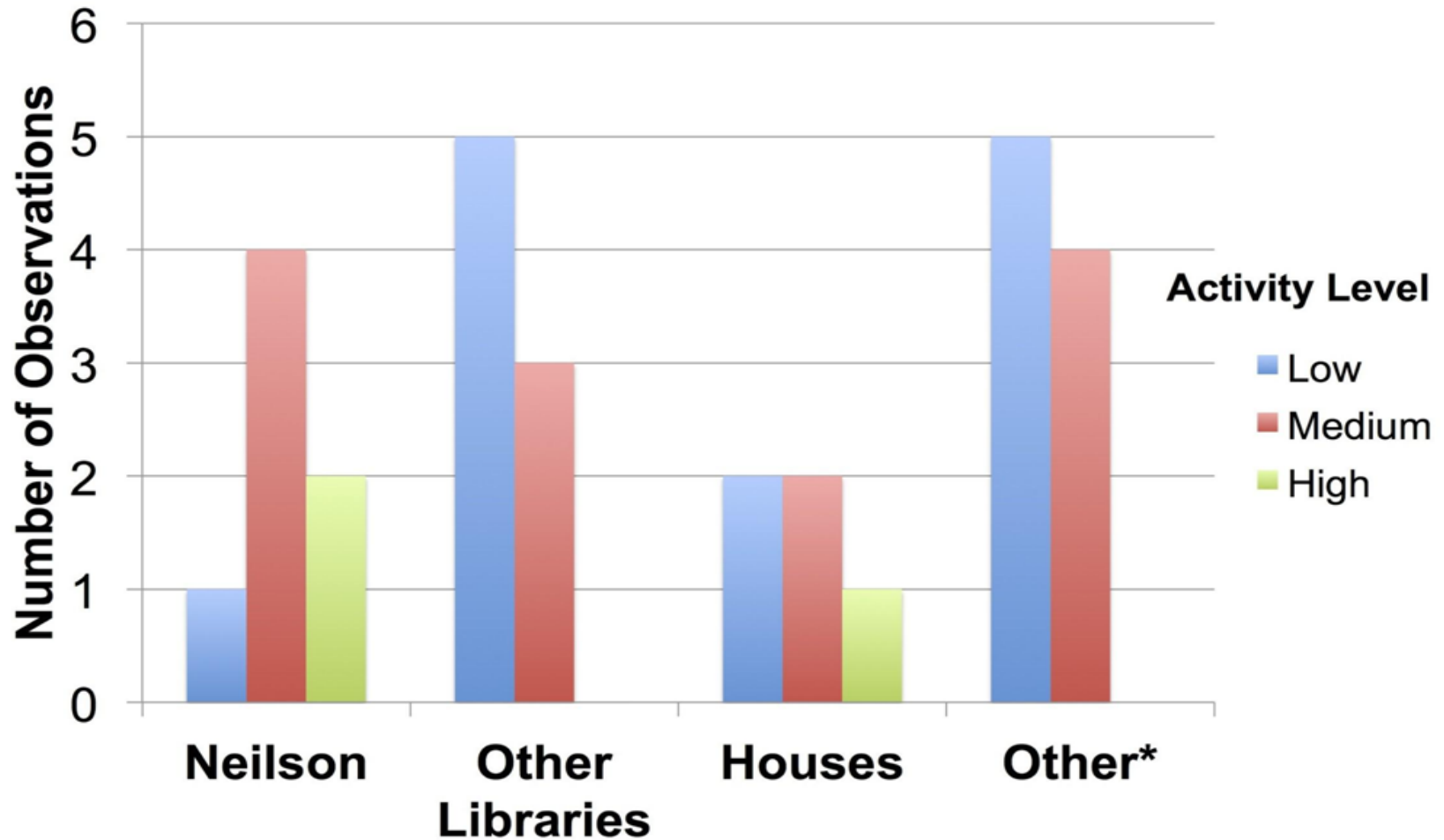

Popularity in Study Location (n=42)

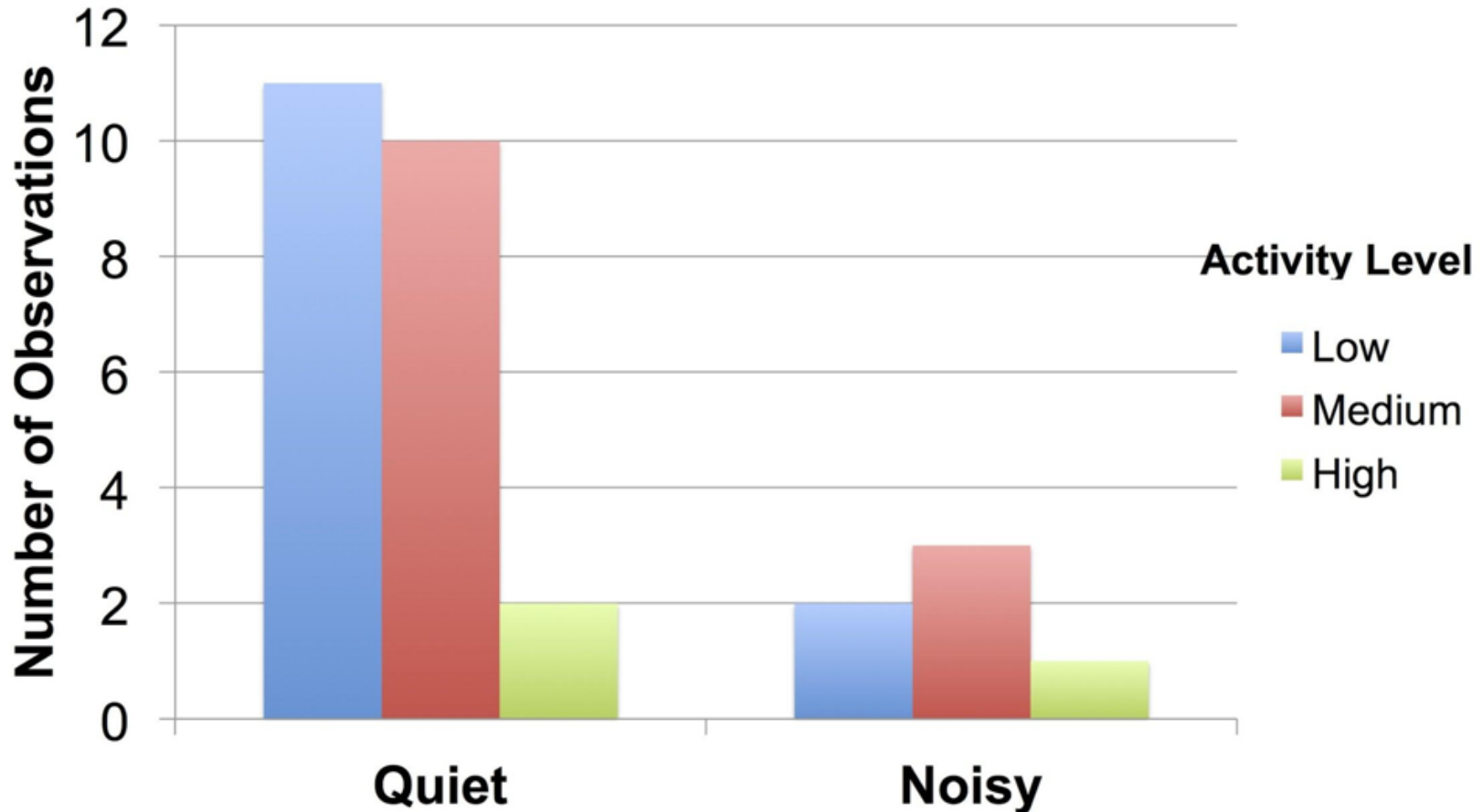

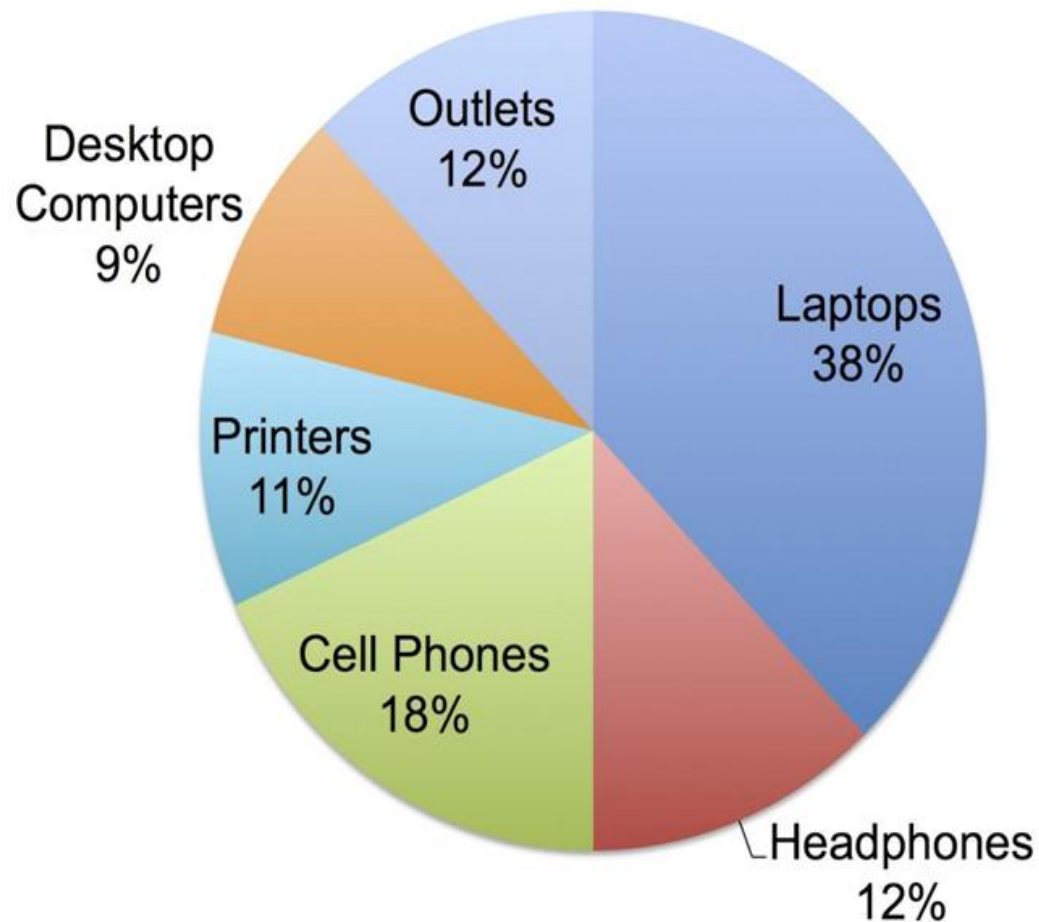
Popularity in Noisy vs. Quiet (n=42)
